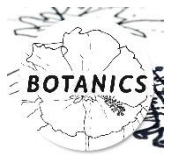

Botanics: a series of apps for teaching ART! By Lee Fullarton

This is a drawing and painting unit for upper primary students. Images of indigenous flora and fauna are used as a metaphor to celebrate the lives of ancestors from ancient times to the present. The migration of the Monarch butterfly is a key feature of this highly coloured artwork, as

it represents the souls of ancestors that return to visit each November.
